


It's been another busy week in Reception as we bring our second full term at Lunt's Heath to a close!

# How do I know that Spring has sprung?

Our Big Question this week has been 'How do I know that Spring has sprung? We have explored all of the signs of Spring through watching videos and participating in a walk around our school grounds to see what we can spot first hands. The children have been keen to share their knowledge from their own experiences at home too such as spotting white and pink blossom on the trees and seeing baby animals.





## Mathematics

In Maths this week the children have been exploring 3D shapes and learning about their properties. They have applied their knowledge of 2D shapes to identify the shape of the faces. We have practically investigated this by dipping the 3D shapes in paint and printing to check our predictions were correct.

In our Maths fluency sessions we have continued our work on doubles of numbers to five- the children are becoming very proficient in their recall!

# THIS WEEK YEAR 1 PRINTING

The children created their own printing block using a piece of polystyrene and a pencil to create the marks. Their design was inspired by artwork (William Morrisartist studied this half term) with the theme of natureplants, flowers and leaves. They used printing ink and a roller and then pressed their design onto paper. They experimented with the effect created by using more than one colour (green and white printing ink) and how it stood out more on a darker piece of card.


