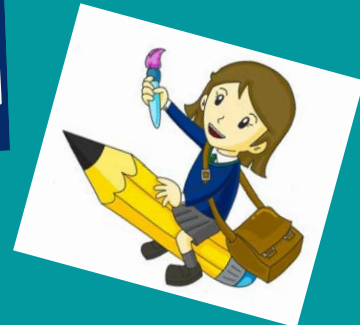

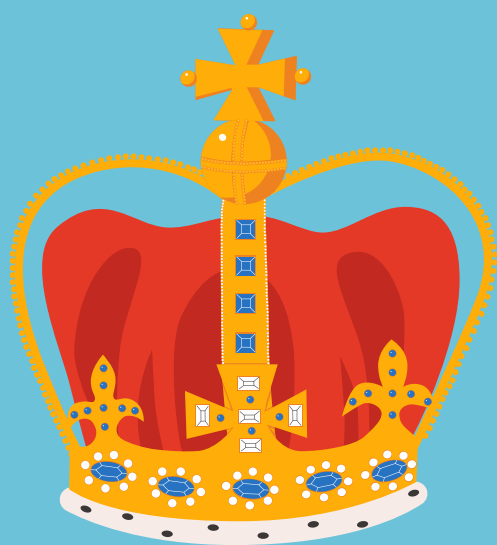
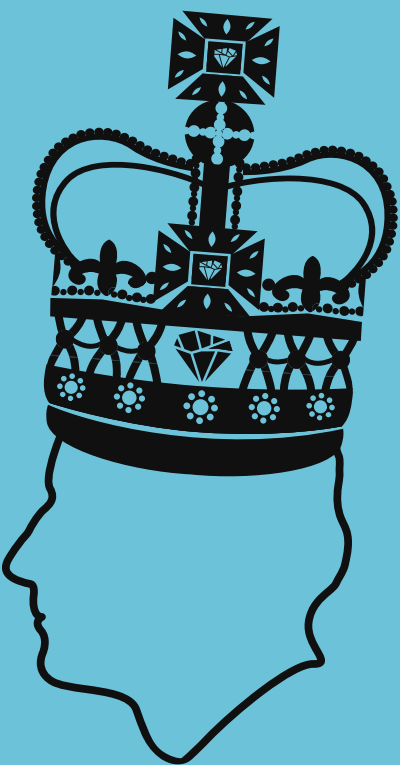

Drawing Club

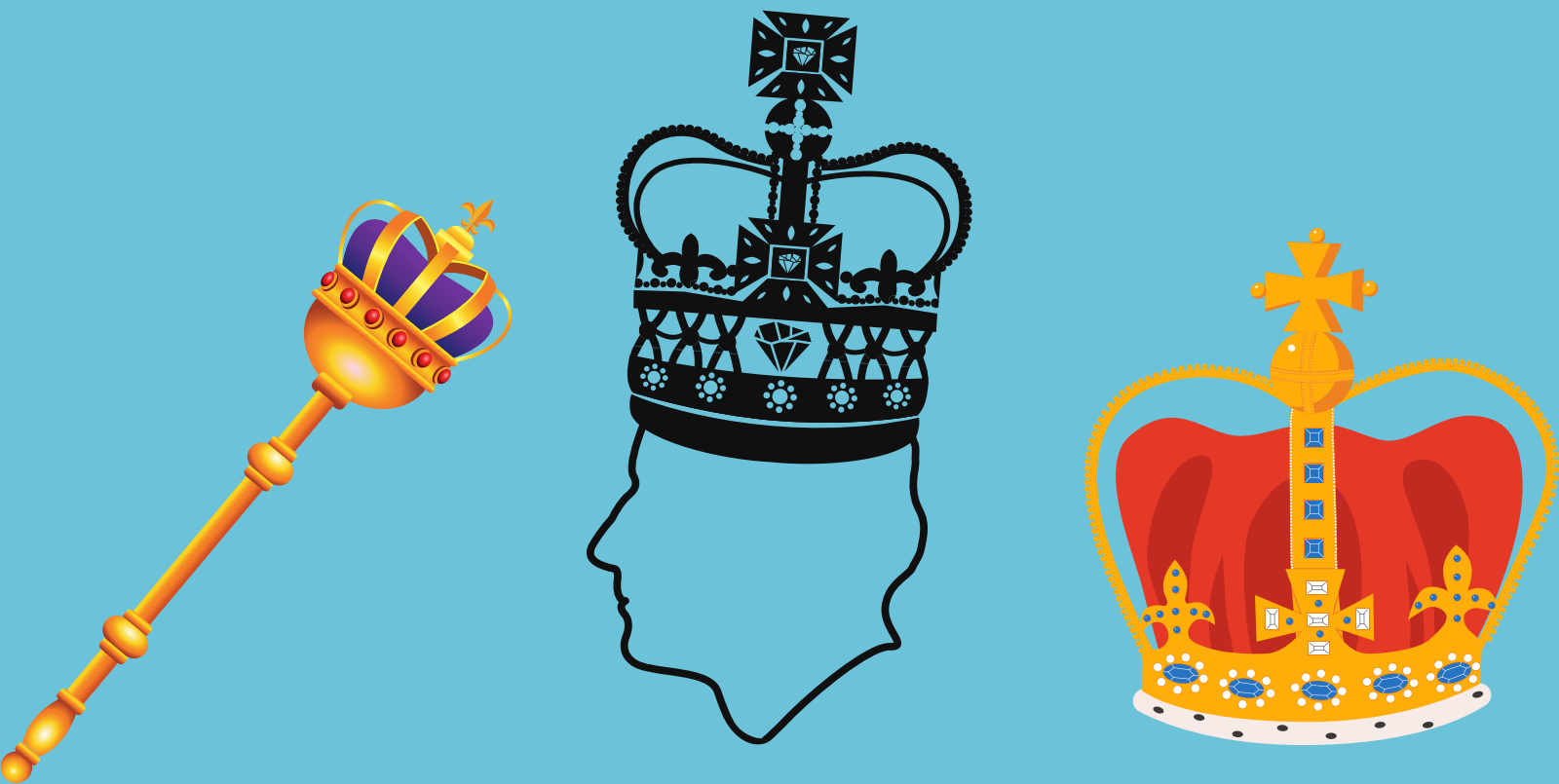
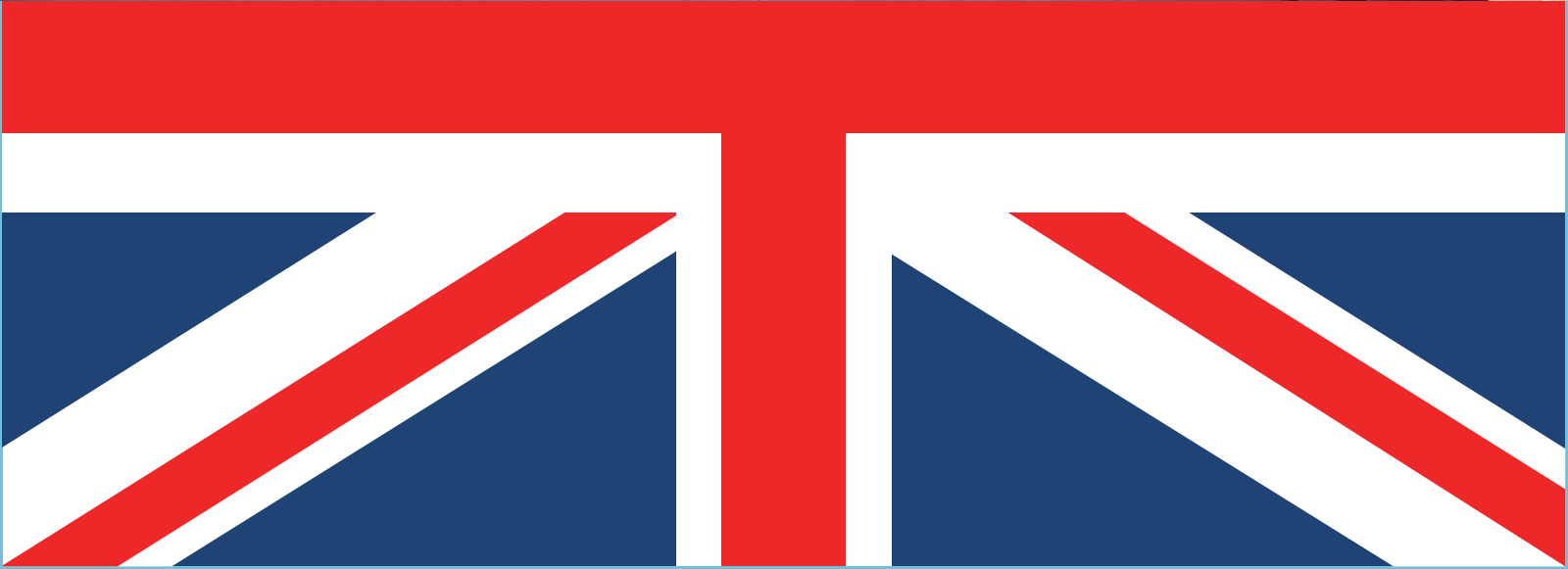

- ✓ Dried lavender flowers

- ✓ Fabric sheet
- ✓ Circular template (like a plant pot!)

- Step 1** Draw around a circle on fabric
- Step 2** Cut out the circle of the fabric using scissors
- Step 3** Place a tiny spoonful of dried lavender in the middle of the circle
- Step 4** Collect the lavender in the fabric and tie around the top using ribbon.

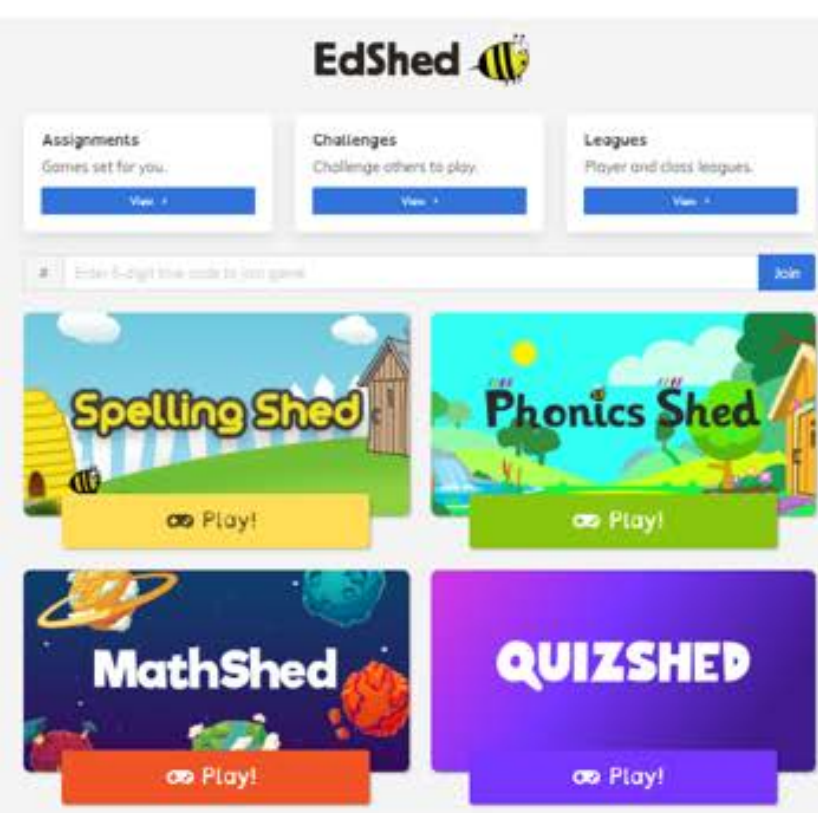
Spelling and Phonics Shed
