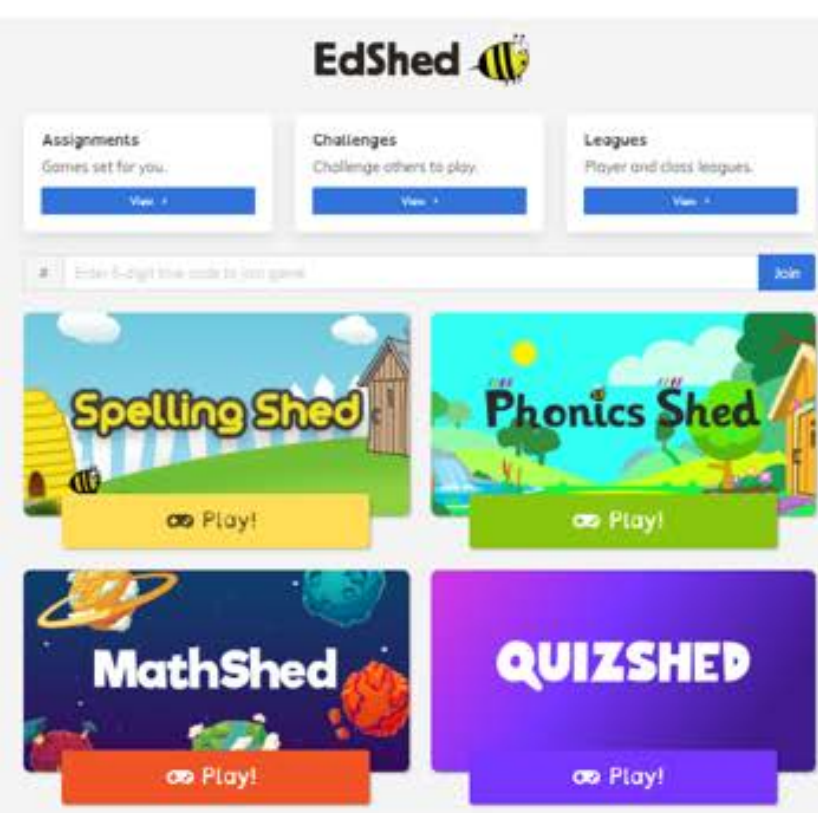
Spelling and Phonics Shed
