YEAR 6 YORK RESIDENTIAL

The children in Year 6 will be leaving for their York residential on Monday. They should arrive at school with their luggage and a waterproof coat at 7.50am so we can leave at 8am. They will require a waterproof coat, a backpack, their packed lunch with a reusable water bottle. Please see reminder facts newsletter this weekend for more information.

SCHOOL MEAL COST INCREASE = £2.70

From September, the cost of school meals will increase to £2.70. This is an increase passed on to us by our provider due to increase in prices affecting them. Remember to consider whether your child would be eligible for a free school meal through pupil premium funding. Contact the office for further eligibility information, if required.

YEAR 4 - MEET THE BARD

On Monday, the children in Year 4 will be sharing their learning from this half term's 'Meet the Bard' workshops with the children in KS2 (parents are not invited to this performance but we will share a recording with parents). The children have been asked to bring in black trousers and a black top to change into on Monday for this performance.

TAG RUGBY TOURNAMENT- DCBL STADIUM

Children from our tag rugby team will be representing the school in a tag rugby tournament held at the DCBL Stadium before Monday night's Widnes Vikings vs Bradford Bulls Match. Children should arrive at the stadium at 5.45pm in full PE kit. They will play in their tournament before the match kick off and be invited onto the pitch at half time for a celebration event. Tickets are available for the match via Widnes Vikings if you would like to support them.

YEAR 4 THEATRE - ALICE IN WONDERLAND AT THE PLAYHOUSE

As part of their work in English the children in Year 4 will be visiting Liverpool Playhouse on Thursday 13th July. The children should come to school wearing full school uniform as usual but will require packed lunch in a disposable bag so they can eat their lunch before leaving at 12.15pm. They can bring an extra drink and a small packet of sweets for the theatre. (No glass bottles / cans / or fizzy drinks). The children will require a waterproof coat. The children will return to school at the later time of 4.30pm and will require collecting by an adult.

YEAR 6 PARENTS' CONSULTATION AND SATS RESULTS

Our Parent Consultation for Year 6 will take place on Friday 14th July, during which the Y6 SATs results will be shared with parents. Please book an appointment to meet your child's teacher on this date via the parents' evening portal via the school website. Y6 will be in school as usual on this day.

DARESBURY LABORATORIES - SCIENCE WORKSHOP

On Monday 10th July, selected children have been chosen to represent the school at Daresbury Laboratory Open Day. If you have received an Evolve inviting your child then they should arrive at school at 8.20am and go to Mr Moore's classroom. The children will require a disposable packed lunch as they will eat their lunch at Daresbury before returning to school in the afternoon. They should be collected from school at the normal time.

SCHOOL NURSE DROP IN SESSION - THURSDAY 13TH JULY AT 2PM

Our school nurse will be visiting school again on Thursday 13th July at 2pm for a parents drop in service. She is keen to discuss any concerns you may have about your child and offer advice and support about many issues, including sleep and fussy eaters etc. No appointment necessary.

"Why do ladybirds have spots?"

Our Big Question this week has been 'Why do ladybirds have spots?' We have enjoyed the story of 'The Bad-Tempered Ladybird' by Eric Carle and the children were inspired to apply their writing skills to speech bubbles, recording what the ladybirds were saying. We again discussed the difference between fiction and non-fiction texts before exploring an information text about ladybirds where we learned that their spots help warn predators not to eat them.



Mathematics

In Maths this week we have been learning about data handling. We have explored, created and interpreted data from pictograms and have also discovered how tally marks can help us when gathering data too.

Drawing Club

In Drawing Club this week we have enjoyed watching an episode of 'Bananaman.' The children have thought of some really imaginative ideas for a superhero hide out and different locations that Bananaman could hide his bananas from his enemies!

A gentle reminder our transition days are next Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. Please see separate letter detailing the specific arrangements for those days. Have a great weekend!


THIS WEEK YEAR 5 - NEW RECEPTION


Our new Year 6 children, spent some time on Wednesday welcoming our new Reception classes that they had written to earlier in the year.

In gardening club, the children enjoyed finding weeds and taking them out in the Early Years garden and woodland.










The New School Year



Children in Year 4 need to complete a Multiplication Tables Check during the Summer 2nd Half Term.

Multiplication facts are needed in virtually all other areas of Mathematics therefore the more confidently children can recall these facts the easier they will find their Mathematics lessons as a barrier to learning is removed.



This can be found on Maths Shed. Click on Times Tables – your child can practice specific times tables that they do not know or attempt to improve their rapid recall by selecting Y4 MTC.

During lockdown we have found that the children's spelling ability was greatly impacted as it was difficult to teach and test spellings virtually.

Spelling shed allows the children to practice their spellings for their age phase in a fun and interactive way through games.

Encourage your child to log into their account, select Spelling Shed or Phonics Shed. Choose their age phase and then they can choose the game type and level of challenge.
