

#### **Mathematics**




'We measured things around the classroom with feet'

We have enjoyed DT this week in 2L. We have been busy working as engineers to design and make a working Ferris wheel.










In DT we have explored suitable materials to use to build the wheel and frame for our ferris wheel.

This week, we made our own blood using different food stuffs to represent the parts of our blood.


















## THIS WEEK (LASS 4L






### THIS WEEK YEAR 6 (HAMPIONS LEAGUE MANCHESTER CITY VS COPENHAGEN
