- Don't leave it too late you are likely to miss out on the school place you want if you apply late. <u>Deadline is 31<sup>st</sup> October 2022</u>





Despite this week being a shorter one it has still been a busy one! We are starting to adopt a more structured timetable with short Phonics and Maths inputs through the day.

In Phonics we have started by looking at the sounds m, a and s. The children have showed real perseverance in their efforts to form their letters.

In our Maths fluency lessons we have been thinking about 'careful counting' and making sure we count with 1:1 correspondence. The children showed great delight in correcting our counting puppets when they were not carefully counting!

In our Maths groups we have been looking at similarities and differences in groups of items. The children approached using their Maths journals for the first time with gusto and were able to match pairs of ladybirds by the number of spots on their backs.

# THIS WEEK YEAR 2 SCIENCE AND GEOGRAPHY


