We are a group of around 13 parents with two teaching staff currently, and our events are tailored to what we can achieve with so few members compared to the number of children and parents within our school community.

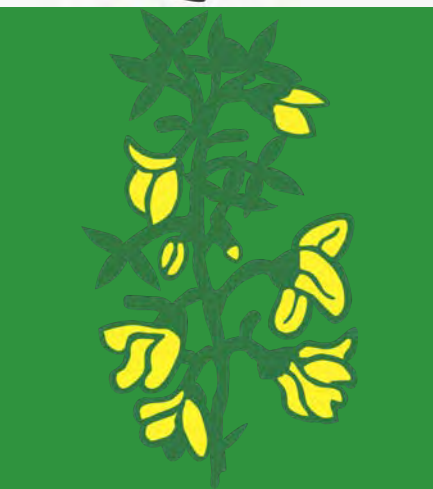
Although we've raised a brilliant amount this year, we would love to do more, but to do this we need extra support to spread the workload of organising events.
