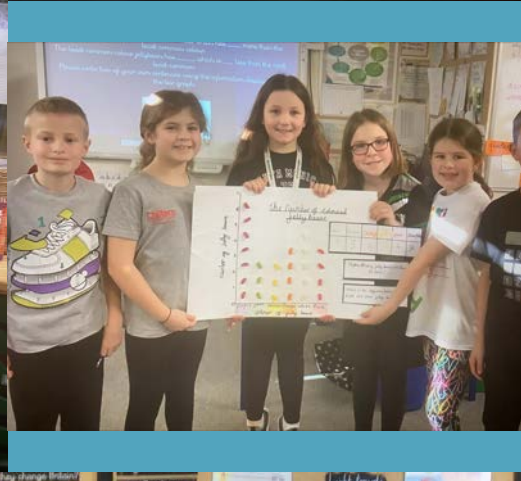
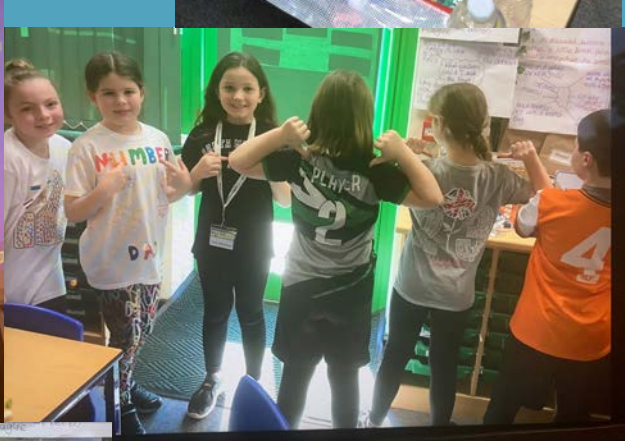

They started using the ten frames to help and then when they sorted the jelly beans by colour the children were able to identify which groups had more and which had fewer.

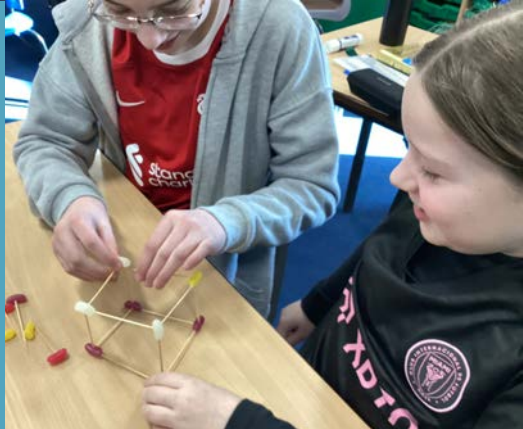


The children in Year 6 calculated the Mode, Median, Mean and Range of their jellybeans.

The children in Year 5 designed their own Maths games with some children using the scratch programme. They then played these against each other. The children made their own 3D shapes using jellybeans.

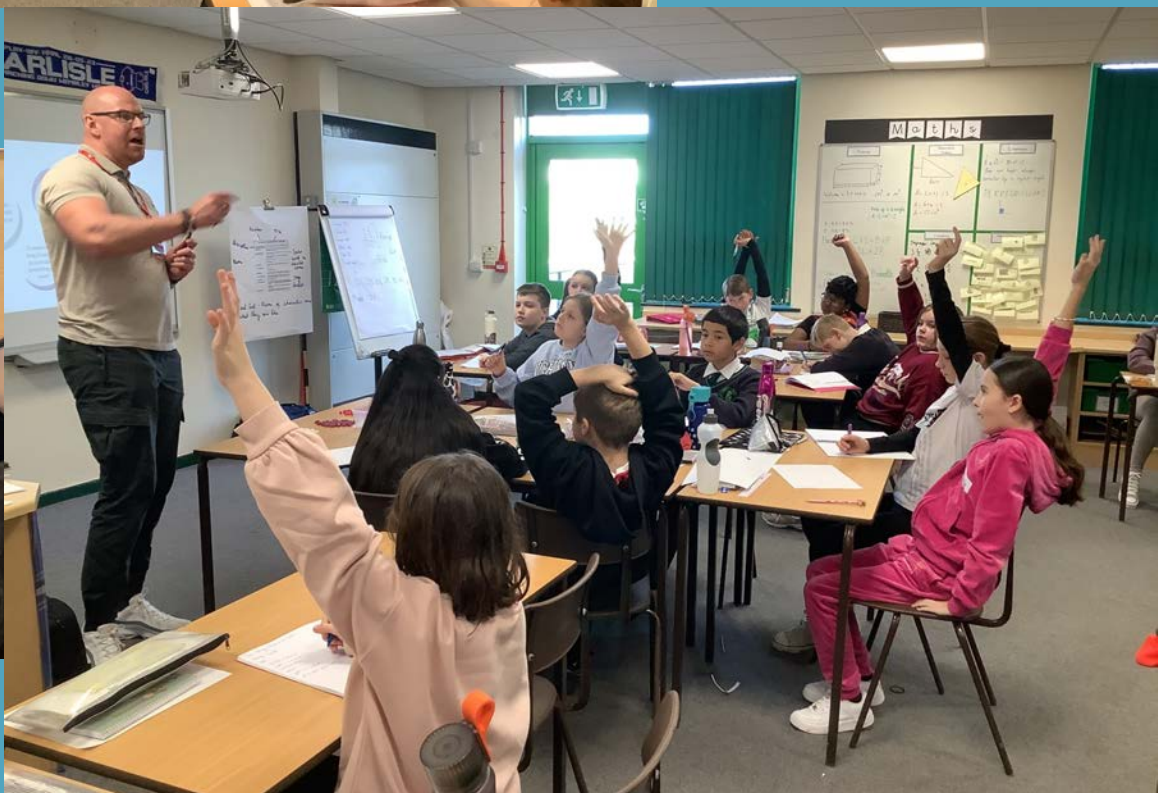
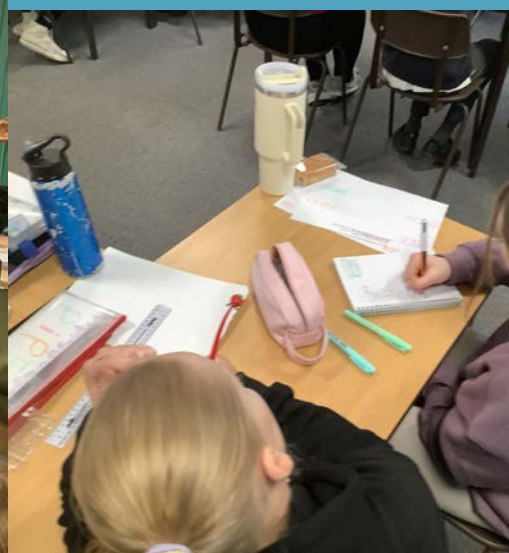


We were lucky enough to have a number of volunteers from our school community to come and talk to our children about how they use Maths in their day-to-day roles.

Dear Parents,

At Lunt's Heath Primary School, on the 9th February 2024 we will be hosting our second Charity Day. Through our school values we teach the children the importance of helping others and the wider community.

As you know, after a competition earlier in the year our Phase Charities were chosen. Year 5 and 6 are supporting The Brain Tumour Charity, Year 3 and 4 Halton Haven Hospice and Key Stage One Liverpool Heart and Chest Charity.

For our next charity day we would like to invite the children to do some baking! The children are invited to create a sweet treat at home (such as a small cake, cookie or biscuit) to bring in to sell to their phase to raise money for their charity. The sweet treats that are brought in will be sold for **£1** per treat. The children are welcome to bring in money to buy a sweet treat made by someone else in their phase.

Due to allergies in the school we ask that you please attach an ingredient list with your sweet treat when the child brings it to school.

A polite reminder we are nut free school so all of the sweet treats cannot contain any form of nut (this includes Nutella).

When bringing in your child's bake please make sure that the container they are in is labelled so we can ensure that they take home the correct container.

Throughout our Charity day the children will be focusing on all of our school values (Ambition, Enterprising, Inner Resilience, Collaboration and Understanding). During the day the children will be creating a sweet treat with their classmates to also sell for **£1**. An evolve will be sent next week to gain permission for your child to partake in making the sweet treat with their classmates. Please keep an eye out for this so your child does not miss out. Please let your child's teacher know of any allergies on the evolve form.

We are aware of the allergies that children have in school and therefore these children will be able to purchase the treats that the children will make in school as they have been adapted to cater for this.

All of the money raised through all of the sweet treats sold will go to the respective charities for that phase.

Any sweet treats bought in school will taken home for the children to enjoy.

We thank you for your support on our Charity days. We know the children gain so much from working together through our school values on these days and they see the impact that their kindness and generosity makes on other communities.

Phonics

The children are making excellent progress with their Phonics skills. Please can you ensure your child has their book bag in school each day with their reading book and diary so we can check in with their progress and change their reading books when needed-thank you.



Mathematics

In Maths we have been using our subitising skills before applying the language of 'more' and 'fewer'. We have then applied this knowledge to help us find one more and one fewer using concrete and pictorial representations to help us.
