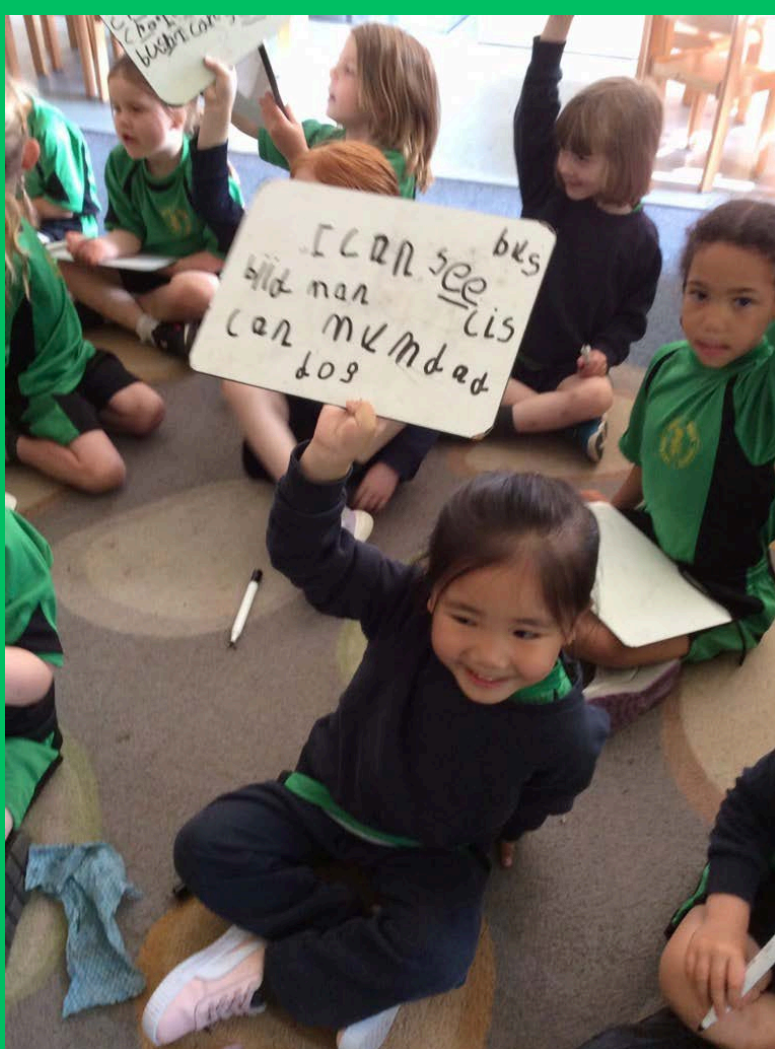
Why is it warmer now than it was at Christmas?
