Mathematics

In Maths this week we have been working on our understanding of mass. We have used balance scales to compare the mass of two objects before using non-standard units to weigh objects from around the classroom.

In our fluency lessons we have also been using a brand new piece of Mathematical equipment called a rekenrek. This has been another tool in helping our understanding of the composition of number.
