Visit to St Luke's Church




Our class ambassadors thought our zoom writing workshop was the highlight of the week as we will be writing our own book. It's still a secret what the book will be about.

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
We completed an online story writing workshop with Live Theatre. We loved creating our story 'The Golden Duo' about a dragon named Fire and his sidekick Baby Timothy.

THIS WEEK YERR 5/6 TENNIS (HRMPIONS




