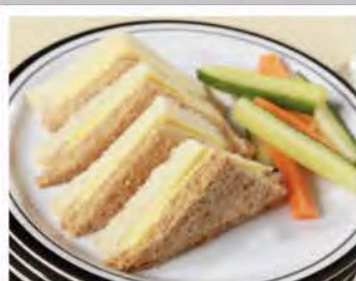

# EYFS

## Newsletter

This week we have started our full teaching timetable! The children are coping brilliantly with their new routines and working hard during our short teaching inputs.

### Phonics

In Phonics we have started to learn our first five initial sounds of m, a, s, d and t. We have also worked carefully on practising to form these letters correctly. We also met Fred the Frog who can only speak in sounds- we have to help him by saying the whole word, applying our oral blending skills!

### Mathematics

In Maths we have been working on identifying similarities and differences across a range of criteria, for example by colour, shape, size, texture and function. We then started our Maths journals where we had to find matching quantities of dot patterns. In our Maths fluency lessons we have been 'using our eyes to subitise' with amounts to two. Subitising is the ability to look at a small number of objects and instantly recognise how many objects there are without needing to count.



### How can I look after myself?

In Topic our Big Question for the next couple of weeks is 'How can I look after myself?' We have been learning lots of different skills and routines that are important around school such as lining up safely, using a knife and fork, washing our hands and changing our shoes to our wellies for outdoor play!

### Reminders

- PE days this half term are Mondays and Wednesdays.
- Doors will open at 8:35 and the school day finishes at 3:05.
- Payment for snack for the half term can be made via the Gateway. We are going to start enjoying snacks such as toast and crackers. We hope this helps promote the children's independence skills as they prepare their own snack and do their own washing up-with adult support and supervision of course!

Thank you once again for your patience and support. We understand that even though we are three weeks into school life, the children are still very much in a transition period and are adjusting to their new routines.

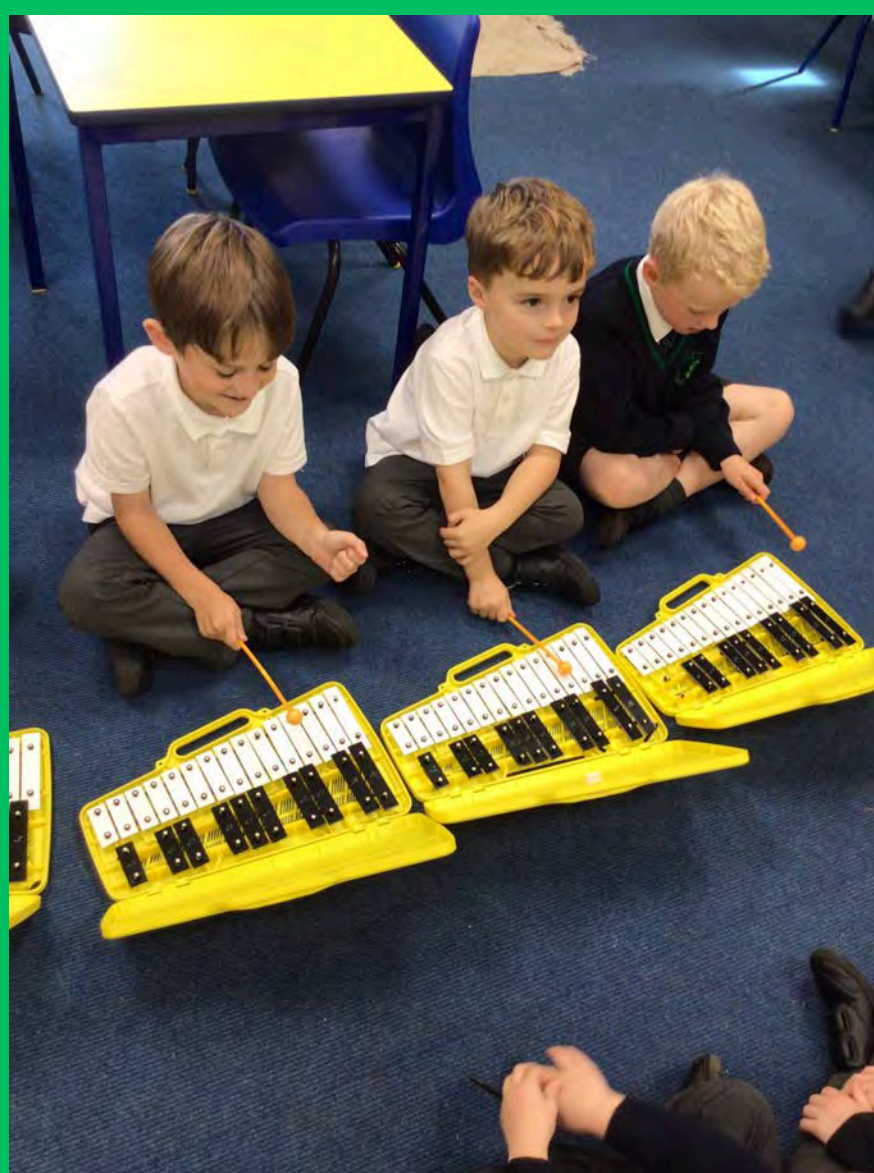

We have enjoyed our PE lesson with the cricket coach this week. We practiced our batting skills and then played a game.

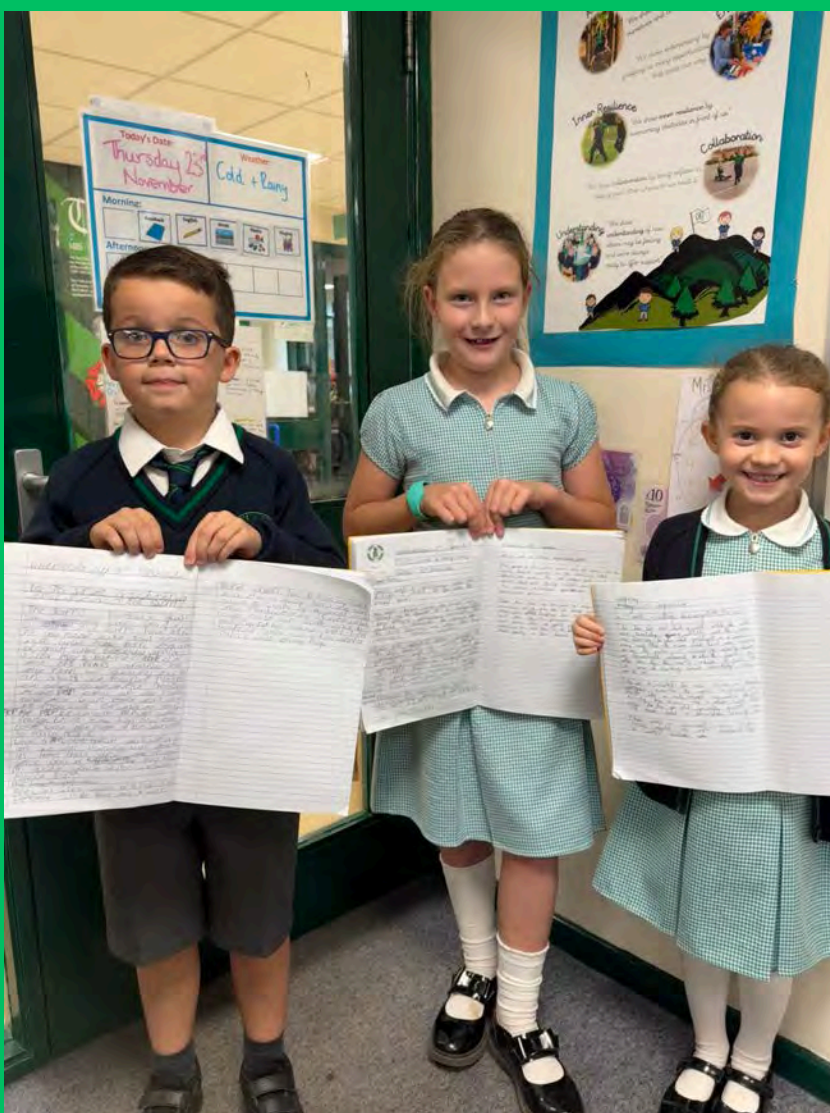

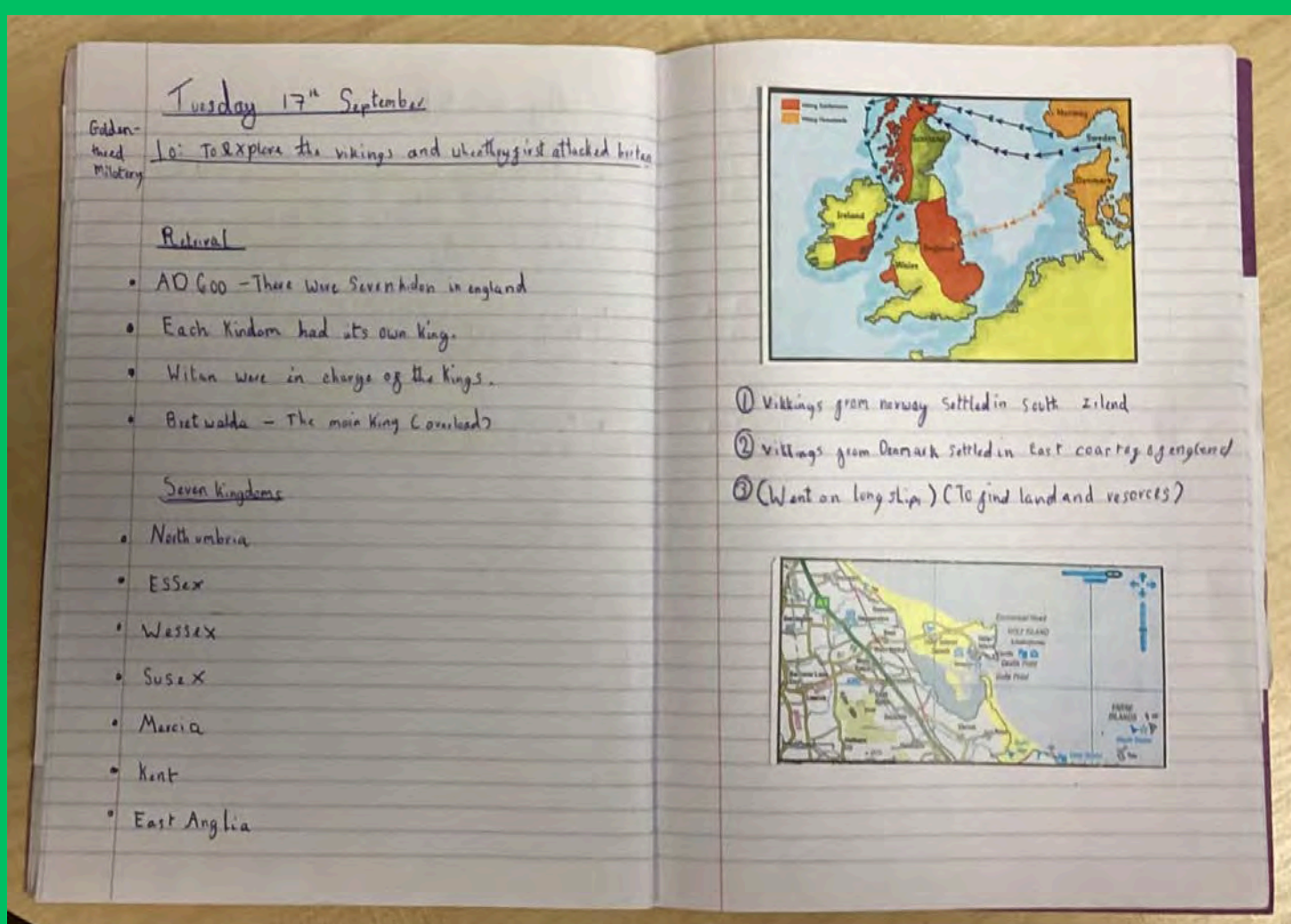

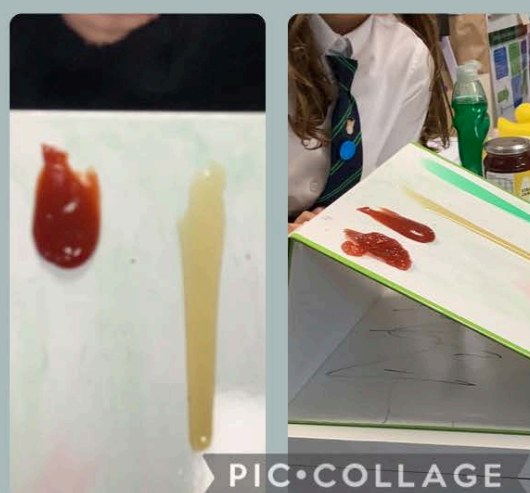
# THIS WEEK
