CLASS 2H SPACE CAMP - THURSDAY 10TH OCTOBER





We started the week with a fabulous visit from Zoo Lab! The children loved meeting the animals and learning all about how the animals have super senses!

Phonics

This week in phonics we have looked at the sounds of c, k, u, b and f. Mathematics

In our Maths fluency lessons we have continued our work on careful counting by helping a counting puppet to count with 1:1 correspondence. The children showed the puppet how we should say one number name for object and the last number we say tells us how many objects are in that set.

In our Maths lessons we have been exploring comparing and ordering by size, length and time through lots of practical and hands on activities.





Our Drawing Club text has been 'The Three Little Pigs'. The children have loved retelling the story using all the repeating refrains and have enjoyed recording their ideas in their drawing club books.

What can I do with my body?

In our Topic lessons our Big Question has been 'What can I do with my body?' We learned about the five senses thanks to our visit from Zoo Lab and also described the changes and developments our own bodies have experienced in our lives to now for example learning to talk and learning to walk. Thank you for sharing the children's photos to help with this activity.

How to help at home:

•You could help your child practise their letter formation using the Read Write Inc formation cues shared on Tapestry.

•You could encourage your child to write their name on greetings cards for special occasions.

•Look for numerals in the environment and encourage your child to identify them e.g. house numbers.

•Practise careful counting of objects (counting with 1:1 correspondence-saying one number name for each item)


As the half term progresses the children are demonstrating great resilience and behaviour for learning so I'm sure they will be ready for a rest this weekend, The EYFS Team

As your child is due to transfer from primary to secondary school in September 2025, we are pleased to advise that the Admission to Secondary School 2025 booklet which explains the arrangements is now available online at <u>School admissions website</u>

It is highly advised that you read this booklet, and then complete the online application available at <u>School admissions website</u>. If any of your preferred schools are in other local authority areas you will need to visit their websites for details on the admission policies and oversubscription criteria. If you are unable to apply online, then please email schooladmissions@halton.gov.uk, or drop into one of the Halton Direct Link Offices to obtain a form or call us on the numbers above.

The timetable for Secondary School admissions is as follows:

September 2024	Admission to Secondary School booklet available online. Online applications open
31 st October 2024	Closing date for receipt of preference forms and online applications
3 rd March 2025	Notification of outcome of preference available online, to those who applied online, and letter posted to parents of paper applicants
31 st March 2025	Closing date for submission of intention to appeal

You should read the booklet carefully, and think about how your child's application will be considered against each of your preference school's oversubscription criteria before indicating that school as a preference. Failure to submit an application may result in the Local Authority being unable to allocate a place for your child at your preferred school.

It is important that you make as many preferences as possible (up to the maximum of 3) to increase your chances of being offered a school of your preference. It is sometimes not possible to offer any of a parent's preferred schools and in these circumstances your child will be allocated a place at the nearest school with vacancies by the Local Authority.

However, this will not affect your right of appeal to an independent appeals panel against the decision not admit your child to your school(s) of preference and details on these procedures will be given to you at that time. If you require any further information please contact a member of the School Admissions Team on the telephone numbers above or by email.

Please note: There is no first-come-first-offered basis for applications. All applications received are considered against the oversubscription criteria for the school. The important thing to do is to make sure that you complete the online application, or submit a paper application form on-time, before the deadline of 31st October 2024. Failure to do so will result in your application being considered as late, and this may harm your chances of being offered the school you prefer. Schools will be holding open day/evening events over the coming months and you should contact your preference school(s) directly for further information.

If your child has an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) you should contact your child's SEND Coordinator to discuss their transition to secondary level education and you **do not** need to make an application as this will be coordinated by the SEND Team.

If you've received this letter and your child does not live in Halton please contact your local authority for details on their scheme and make your application to your home local authority, even if you wish to make preferences for Halton schools.

Schools will be holding open day/evening events over the coming months and you should contact your preference school(s) directly for further information.

If your child has an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) you should contact your child's SEND Coordinator to discuss their application and you **do not** need to make an application as this will be coordinated by the SEND Team.

If you've received this letter and your child does not live in Halton please contact your local authority for details on their scheme and make your application to your home local authority, even if you wish to make preferences for Halton schools.


- You must complete a preference form online at <u>School</u> <u>admissions website</u>, where you will be given a receipt


