OFSTED

As you will have been aware, school was visited by OFSTED on Tuesday and Wednesday of this week with our first inspection in 10 years.

We are unable to share the outcome with you as yet, but the children were magnificent! We were and are so very proud of them.

HARVEST COLLECTION AND YEAR 3 HARVEST SERVICE

This year we will again be supporting Widnes Foodbank as part of our Harvest Celebrations. The culmination of our Harvest celebrations will be on Thursday 24th October when Year 3 accompanied by Year 4 will perform their Harvest Service at St Luke's church at 9.30am. Year 3 and 4 parents are invited to attend this service. Children will be walked to the church by school staff. Parents can arrive at St Luke's from 9.20am

CLASS 6L BIKEABILITY = MONDAY 21ST - THURSDAY 24TH OCTOBER

Class 6H will be participating in their Bikeability sessions next week between Monday 21st October and Thursday 24th October next week. The children in this class should bring their bikes and helmets into school on Monday and take them via the junior gate to the bottom playground. The children can leave their bikes in school if you wish and take them home on Thursday evening. The children should wear outdoor PE kit (they must wear jogging pants not shorts to participate in the training as directed by Cycle Ready company). They will continue to take part in the training even if the weather is inclement so must have a waterproof coat.

EYFS PARENT CONSULTATION EVENING -TUESDAY 22ND AND THURSDAY 24TH OCTOBER 3.30-6.30PM

We will be holding our EYFS Parent Consultation Evening next Tuesday and Thursday with your child's new class teacher. Please book an appointment using the Parents' Evening Booking System, accessed via the school website for your child/children. If you are a two household family and require separate appointments then please contact the office directly. These meetings will take place in Mr Hawkins classroom, 3L which can be accessed via the gate at the front of the school next to the school office.

Next week we will be holding our charity house days. Each phase will celebrate their HOUSE DAY on a different date. This will enable them to spend their House Day completing a range of different activities based on our school values and their chosen charity, culminating in their charity colour run. On their house day listed below, rather than their house coloured t-shirt we would like to ask the children to come to school in a white/ light or dark coloured t-shirt (We encourage this to be an old t-shirt). We invite them to wear colourful leggings/shorts/trousers (not school uniform). It is also recommended that your child wears sunglasses/ goggles during the run to protect their eyes. We recommend they wear shoes that can be wiped clean, e.g. wellies etc. The run will be completed at the end of the day, so you may wish for your children to bring a bin bag to wear over themselves as not to get your cars decorated in colour! We also recommend that your child does not bring their school bag on this day and if they are packed lunch they bring this in a disposable bag. In November, Year 6 will be hosting a toy swap; raising money for our school charities.



The swap even will be parents only so you have the opportunity to grab any last-minute presents before sending them off to Santal





Mathematics

In our Maths Fluency sessions this week, the children have started to build on their subitising skills. They will continue to use 'perceptual' subitising – instant recognition – by saying the number of sounds that they can hear, such as claps or drum beats, without needing to count. They will be encouraged to look closely at small quantities and observe whether the quantity has changed or only the arrangement.

In our Maths lessons we have been refining our skills on being able to count reliably (with one-to-one correspondence and understanding of cardinality) up to five forwards and backwards.



Our Drawing Club text has been 'Not Now Bernard.' The children have enjoyed drawing their own monsters and have been using some amazing vocabulary inspired by the text!

'Why do I look like I do?'

In our Topic lessons our Big Question has been 'Why do I look like I do?' The children have enjoyed creating self portraits by looking closely at their reflections in the mirror, naming our body parts and recapping our senses ensuring we understand which body parts we use for each sense.




This week, Year 4 created a conscious Alley to explore the advantages of living either above or underground and did a great job debating!
