Printing	Printing makes a copy. You could paint your hand, press it down on paper and you would see a copy of your handprint
pattern	A repeated decorative design A regular repeated design or reoccurring sequence
Relief printing	Relief printing is where the design sticks out from the surface. This bit gets covered with ink or paint. Potato prints and adinkra stamps are examples of relief printing.
William Morris	He was born in 1834 and died aged 62 in 1896. He was a British textile designer, poet, novelist, translator. His career started when he decorated his own house. He made patterned printed wallpaper.
Lines	Straight - a line in the same direction that connects two points Curved - a smooth line that curves in different

	directions Zig-zag - a line that has lots of short, sharp turns
Repeating	The appearance of the same line, colour, shape or other visual element of a design.
Rotating	The shape itself stays exactly the same, but its position in the space will change.
Engraving	Engraving is a technique where the design is carved into the surface. The surface is then inked and the design printed. Engraving is a form of relief printing.
